Government expectations are that with regard to placement in school

### CHILDREN WILL ATTEND THEIR NEAREST GOVERNMENT SCHOOL

- all schools are expected to implement enrolment procedures in line with this expectation
- the closest government school is determined in metropolitan areas as "a straight line from the student's residence"
- this is reflected in **Neighbourhood Area Maps**
- each government school has a *neighbourhood area map*
- Kingsville Primary School is the closest government school for all families living within our *neighbourhood area map*
- any families living outside of that area who having read and understood Government expectations as listed above and still wish to seek enrolment at Kingsville Primary School need to discuss the reasons for this with myself as Principal or, Carolyn Withers Assistant Principal.

All schools in our local network of government schools will be working together in 2013 and beyond in managing enrolments in line with "the local school expectation".

### General Guidelines for Parents when making any Payments to the school:

**End of Terms 1, 2 & 3** All payments need to be made prior to 10:00am on the last day of term.

**End of Term 4** All payments must be made 2 days prior to the end of term.

To our Year 3 and 5 students who completed Naplan testing this week. They carried out this compulsory testing with confidence and without fuss or drama. There may have been a little anxiety for some, but with encouragement from teachers and parents they were all able to "show what they know" so to speak and should feel very satisfied with their efforts.

Thank you to our expert Year 3 and 5 staff for preparing the students for the testing and to Dianne Sturrock as Naplan co-ordinator for her leadership and management.

Parents in 2013 nationally however may have been doing a bit more Naplan preparation themselves at home with students. Last week the 9<sup>th</sup> best selling book in Australia was

*School Zone Naplan Style Workbook: Year 3 Numeracy.*

Hopefully there was not too much pressure applied in Kingsville "home schooling" leading up to the tests. There has been research carried out about the stress felt by students especially in Year 3 and the Australia Principals Association is conducting further studies in this area.

So well done to Kingsville students – you handled this hurdle very well.

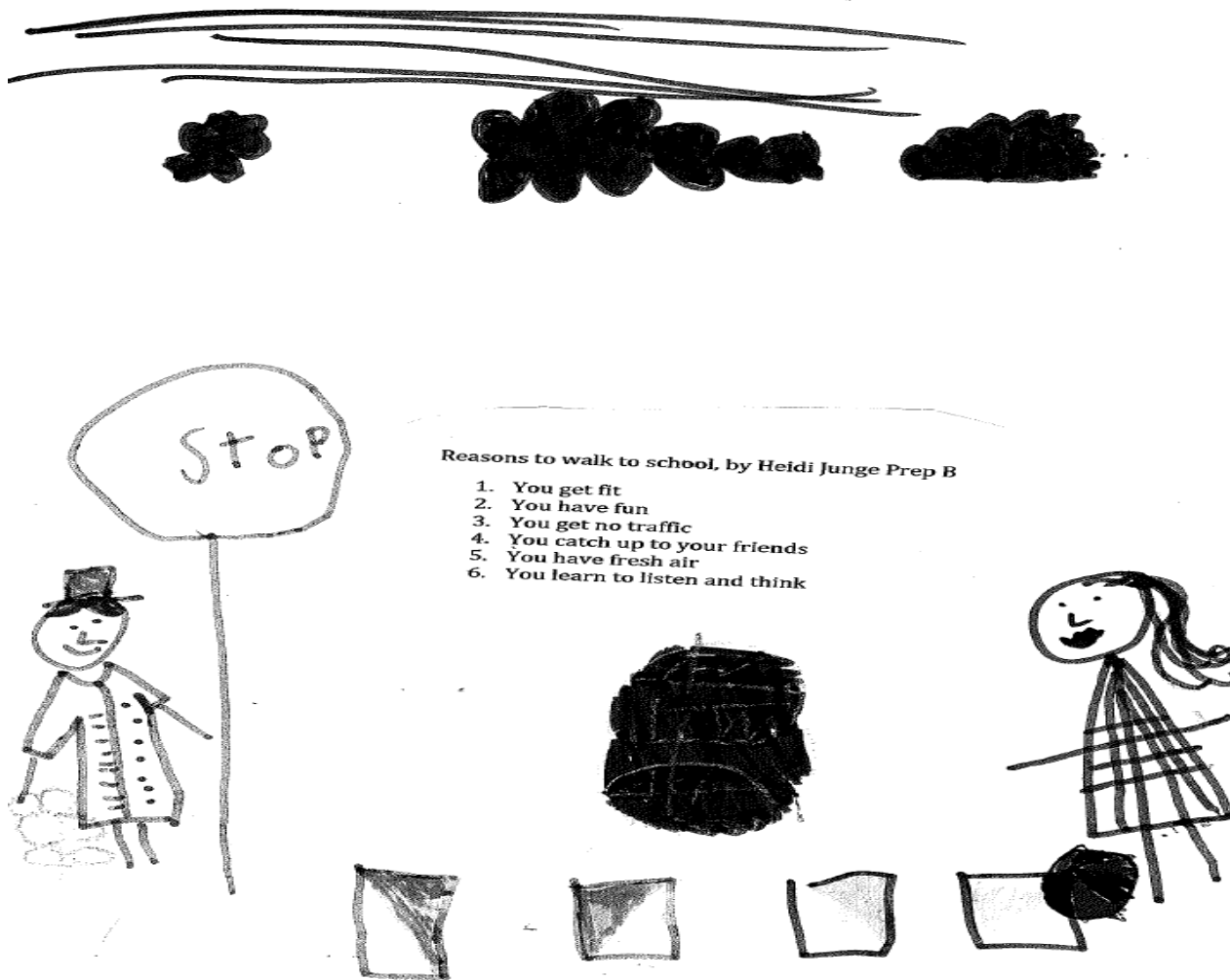

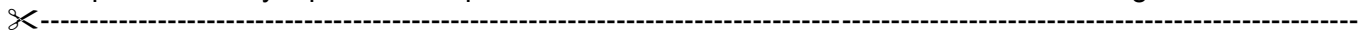

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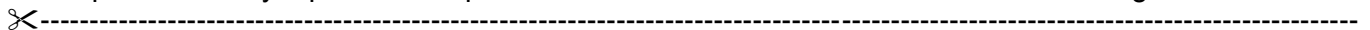
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
