Prep enrolments 2018

We have begun enrolling Foundation students for 2018. A specific reminder to all Kingsville families if you have a younger child to begin Foundation 2018 and you have not yet enrolled them please take action regarding this now.

It is not enough to assume that a sibling can just be enrolled at any late stage of the year, we need to have siblings enrolled by the end of August. This allows us to begin planning for the following year and provide predictions of enrolment to the government as required.

Firstly a huge thank you to all the children for their exemplary behaviour, willingness to give everything a try and for a great attitude all day. The event was a great success with the children living out everything we talk about in sport being displayed on the day.

Appreciation of other people's efforts, **enthusiasm** shown by the smiles on faces, **commitment** to the event (particularly with hurdles or trying Taekwondo), **confidence** to give new events such as high jump or Ultimate Frisbee a go, and **resilience** when they knew that they have done their best and to keep going despite the cold weather. Finally, **tolerance** in the understanding that, especially at the athletics carnival, the day was all about participation for some and competition for others.

To the staff, parents and students and teacher from Bayside P-9 College who supported the event, thank you for your time, effort and flexibility. Events like these do not just happen, and certainly we couldn't run our senior athletics carnival without a significant contribution and help from a group of committed and willing community members. Logistically, getting over 360 children to the event and then organising 15 groups to compete across 8 events within a given time frame is an experience that requires sustained effort and focus.

We still have a couple of events for some age groups to complete at school, long jump and 800m. Once these events are completed we will be able to finalise competitors for the district athletics, announce the winning Kingsville house for the athletics day as well as distribute ribbons to the top four students (boys/girls) for each event in each age category.

The Yarraville District School Sports Victoria (YDSSV) Athletics Day will be held at Newport Park on Thursday 11th August. The names of all students who qualified to represent Kingsville Primary School at the YDSSV Athletics Day will be placed on the sports noticeboard soon.

While the senior part of the school was participating in the Kingsville Athletics Day at Newport Park the junior students were participating in a Sports Expo at school in the following sports: Taekwondo, Ultimate Frisbee, Athletics and circus skills. The students had a marvellous day exploring these different sports, learning new skills and becoming knowledgeable about some alternative and different sports that could be played.

Again, thank you to each parent, teacher and student for making the events on Tuesday such an enjoyable experience for all involved.
