# Principal's Message

Thank you to parents, staff and students for the manner in which you came together yesterday throughout a challenging day in response to the unexpected fire event.

Emergency action plans are in place in all government schools and are verified by DET on a regular basis. During our recent review our plans were marked as excellent and they were certainly put to the test yesterday. Practice drills of course are carried out on a regular basis and students and staff were fully able to participate in a “seal the building” lockdown environment throughout the day. Information provided to families during the day was accurate and informed by guidance and direction from both emergency services and senior staff at our government regional office.

When a direction was given that required what is termed as an “orderly closure” of a number of schools in the area the response from Kingsville parents and family members was immediate. It is important to note that Kingsville or other government schools **did not close**. This was certainly a point of confusion in some communities but, DET employees duty of care responsibility requires them to provide for students as if a normal day even when there are unexpected or emergency circumstances therefore, schools must remain open. In response to the orderly closure and collection of students request most parents did take their children home and there were only 20 students remaining at 2.30pm.

The day began with everyone together in the hall and staff took up roles duties and responsibilities in a calm and professional manner. As the day progressed flexibility was demonstrated in “bucket loads” and a team effort ensured employees and students were safe and informed. To KPS parents A+ with our current communication system we even had emails from overseas and interstate. To parents who have thanked us for the communications and actions that feedback has been very much appreciated. To Glen Yates our School Council President who was on the job with me before 7am and communicating with parents thank you for this work. I know that Glen, school council members and, so many parents kept the flow of accurate information rolling out throughout the day. To the schools amazing leadership and administration team Peter Ritchie, Jeff McDonald, Blagma Veljanoska, Sharyn Fletcher and Betty Petrovski congratulations from the whole school community. These staff led, coordinated, dealt with the media, took hundreds or phone calls and sent and responded to so many emails with care and patience. To teaching and support staff who assisted in the office thank you a job well done in typical Kingsville style. Response from DET, our Regional Office and, our Senior Education Improvement Officer John Stone were immediate, responsive and ongoing. We are very lucky to be located in such a supportive region in the Inner West of Melbourne.

Parents please always remember, in circumstances such as those that presented yesterday if you cannot get to the school to collect your children never feel that this is a problem or something to be stressed about. Whilst parents may be asked rarely to collect students as possible, the children will always be cared for here and the after school program will continue to provide a service even if there were only a few students needing it.

So a great team effort – well done everyone.




### Costumes
