BACKGROUND

The Dress Code was introduced by School Council in 1996 and is reviewed every two years. The Code, which includes details of the compulsory school uniform, is school policy and takes precedence over students' individual preference in matters of dress.

School Council has carefully considered the key criteria set down in the 'Education and Training Reform Act 2006' (and amendments) and the Education and Training Reform Regulations 2017 in the development of the Code. As such, School Council believes the Code is:

- respectful of the cultural norms of the school community
- suitable for students in regard to the tasks and functions required at school
- reasonable and contemporary
- appropriate in consideration of health and safety

SCHOOL COLOURS AND LOGO

The school colors are navy, red and gold. The school logo (in the school colors) features a 'jumping' K and continuing swirl to create a large circle. A small circle is above the K and the words, Kingsville Primary School appear below.

CLOTHING

The Dress Code requires all students to wear school uniform every day, unless they are covered by an exemption (detailed in this document). The exception to this is any 'casual or costume' days as approved by School Council.

The uniform consists of:

- a. items as outlined in the School Uniform List and available from Primary School Wear (PSW)
- b. items purchased elsewhere that match our school and style and have no other logo, writing or decoration on them
- c. a combination of the above

PRIMARY SCHOOL WEAR (PSW)

The majority of uniform items are supplied by PSW, an external provider of uniforms, and can be purchased at the Uniform Shop in store (Deer Park) or online at www.psw.com.au. To contact PSW direct please call 9768 0342.

FOOTWEAR

The Dress Code requires all students to wear suitable, safe, closed in footwear, which allows them to participate in the full range of school activities. **School Council highly**

recommends black school shoes or plain white or black runners with a non-marking sole. Thongs, sandals, crocs and slip on party type shoes are not permitted

HATS

Sun hats are compulsory from 1st September to 30th April, in line with *The Cancer Council Victoria SunSmart Program*, an internationally recognized skin cancer prevention program. Students must wear either the navy legionnaire hat or, a navy slouch hat. Both are available from PSW.

From May to August, hats are not compulsory however students may continue to wear a sun hat or plain navy beanie.

BAGS

All students require a functional school bag, with their name clearly marked on it. **School Council highly recommends either –**

- the **Kingsville Primary School bag** available from the PSW
- the “hi-vis” school bag available from: <https://www.schoolbags.com.au/your-school/kingsville-primary-school.html>

RELIGIOUS HEADWEAR

Students may wear religious headwear, such as a hijab or kippah. However, **School Council highly recommends these are in the school colors.**

DRESS CODE EXEMPTION

School Council, in compliance with Equal Opportunity law, provides grounds for exemptions when the Dress Code:

- offends a religious belief by the student or parent
- prevents a student from complying with a requirement of his/her ethnic background
- prevents a student with a disability from being able to attend school or participate in school activities
- is not suitable for a student with a particular health or size condition
- is not suitable for a student when the parents can demonstrate particular economic hardship

When a request for an exemption is made, the Principal and School Council President will consider what type of exemption may be suitable. Partial modification of dress requirement rather than, complete exemption is always investigated during this process. A child who gains a partial exemption is still required to wear other items as stipulated in the Dress Code.

Requests for exemption are kept by the Principal and School Council President in the strictest confidence.

YEAR 6 SIGNATURE ITEM

The traditional Year 6 Signature Item is a red rugby jumper, printed with the KPS logo on the front and the year and student and staff names on the back.

However, a change to this item can be made, if approval from School Council is gained during the conceptual stage in Term 4 of the preceding year. The process for this would be that –

- prospective year 6 students designing a new signature item that includes the school logo
- the design presented to the cohort and year 6 teachers, and then with their endorsement, presented to council by mid Term 4 for approval

REVIEW OF THE DRESS CODE

School Council will carry out a review of the Dress Code every two years and report on this via School Council meetings. If a change is deemed necessary, to reflect emerging safety issues or any significant changes within the school community, consultation regarding the proposed change will be carried out in line with DET regulations. If any change is determined by Council it will be communicated to the school community.

COMMUNICATION OF THE DRESS CODE

Prospective students and parents are notified of the Dress Code prior to enrolment and opportunities to view and order the school uniform items are provided. It is also available on the school website or by request.

OBSERVING THE DRESS CODE

If a student is not dressed according to the Dress Code, the following course of action is undertaken:

1. phone call and/or note sent home
2. copy of the Dress Code is sent home to be read, signed and returned
3. follow up phone call, if required

If the student continues to not comply with the Dress Code, constructive communication between the Principal, Assistant Principal, student and parents begins. Parents are required to provide reasons why their child is not conforming to the Dress Code. These

reasons are immediately investigated and acted upon by the Principal, in liaison with DET as necessary.

HEALTH AND SAFETY ISSUES

For healthy and safety reasons, the following criteria must be adhered to by all students:

- jewellery (excluding small earrings or studs and watches) is dangerous and not permitted. Religious or cultural significant jewellery must be worn inside clothing at all times
- fingernails should be short and clean
- shoulder length hair and longer must be tied back
- students should be dressed appropriately for weather conditions and the activities they are involved in

OTHER ITEMS

- Navy school bag with logo (PSW)

- Hair accessories in navy, red or gold
- Winter neck scarves in navy, red or gold

SPORTS UNIFORM

Sports tops are available to all students and can be ordered through PSW. These tops are not compulsory but may be worn at:

- Weekly P.E. lessons
- Participation in athletics
- Interschool sports

The alternative to the sport's top is a red polo.

SPORTS TEAMS

Students participate in a range of summer and winter interschool sports. A sports uniform is required for these teams, which is made up of:

- School supplied sports top
- Student's sports top or red polo
- Navy shorts/skort/skirt

FOOTBALL

- School supplied long sleeve red and navy blue top
- Navy shorts/skort/skirt

SOCCER

- School supplied long sleeve red and navy blue top
- Navy shorts/skort/skirt

BASKETBALL

- Short sleeve red and blue top

CRICKET

Students are encouraged to wear white however, if this is not possible, students may wear:

- Student's sports top or red polo
- Navy shorts/skort/skirt

ALL OTHER SPORTS (including athletics)

- Student's sports top or red polo
- Navy shorts/skort/skirt
