School Council 2019

Information regarding the processes involved to fill vacancies on the KPS School Council is always provided to the community at both the end of one school year and the beginning of the next. In 2019 I am pleased to say we have 42 new families joining our school community. It is vital that they along with all other families are fully aware of the procedures relating to the yearly school council election process.

In the first newsletter for 2019 distributed on Feb 1st details of school council vacancies were published. Information included the election timeline and a parent information flyer provided by The Department of Education & Training (DET). In addition to this and, in line with regulations a number of notices were put up on display around the school on Monday morning Feb 4th. These notices in entry ways and, on doors have a heading of SCHEDULE 4: NOTICE OF ELECTION AND CALL FOR NOMINATIONS. They clearly indicate the number of positions vacant in each of the two membership categories that is - DET (employee member) and PARENT member being -

They also state that forms in response to this call for nominations can be obtained from the school office and must be lodged by 4p.m. next Monday 11th Feb.

After the close of nominations a set process is followed. Please see full details of this in the School Council Election Timeline in newsletter Feb 1st.

Please note - if the number of nominations exceeds the vacancies in either the category then, a **ballot** will be required.

If any Kingsville parent eligible to self nominate or, be nominated has a question about the process or, the role of a school councillor please do not hesitate to contact myself or our school council President, Glen Yates prior to close of nominations. The first school council meeting for 2019 will be held on Feb 18th. Depending upon whether or not a ballot is required this meeting will either be the last meeting of current school council or, the first meeting of new school council.

Teacher planning weeks

In 2019 there will be two teacher planning weeks, one in Term 1 and one in Term 4. The Term 1 planning week is next week beginning Feb 11th and Term 3 Planning Week is Week 1 15th – 19th July

What happens during these weeks?

During these weeks a day is allocated to class teachers in levels and specialists teachers to collaboratively plan the teaching and learning for the next term. This planning is driven through one of the six transdisciplinary themes to create a unit of inquiry, e.g. “Sharing the Planet”. Teachers in teams reflect on the disciplines of Numeracy, English, Humanities, Science, Technology and The Arts and plan to incorporate important skills and knowledge into the unit. They also focus on planning “stand-alone” units within these subject areas. The specialists also plan collaboratively and contribute to one specific unit of inquiry from each level during the year. They will explore their own discipline, connecting the five essential elements and continuing the coherent nature of a transdisciplinary program.

At the heart of the transdisciplinary curriculum is the learner constructing meaning through the five essential elements: concepts, knowledge, skills, attitudes and actions. These elements go beyond disciplinary barriers and forge the curriculum into a coherent whole.

The curriculum is transdisciplinary in nature because the meaning of the prefix “trans” is two-fold: to convey learning that has relevance across, between and beyond the subject areas and more importantly, learning that transcends the confines of the subject areas to connect to what is real in the world.

Through acknowledging and aiming to meet the diverse needs of the student – physical, social, intellectual, aesthetic, cultural, the programme aims to create learning that is engaging, relevant, challenging and significant.

Inquiry is the pedagogical approach to teaching and learning at Kingsville Primary School. It is the process initiated by the students or the teacher that moves the students from their current level of understanding to a new and deeper level of understanding. This can mean:

- exploring, wondering and questioning
- experimenting and playing with possibilities
- making connections between previous learning and current learning
- making predictions and acting purposefully to see what happens
- collecting data and reporting findings
- clarifying existing ideas and reappraising perceptions of events
- deepening understanding through the application of a concept
- making and testing theories
- researching and seeking information
- taking and defending a position
- solving problems in a variety of ways

It is a significant undertaking by the school both logistically and financially to facilitate a time such as this, for teachers to engage in a collaborative exercise that takes into account the approach outlined above.

On the day that teams are planning, the classroom program continues with the support of the specialists and casual relief teachers. The class teachers will talk to the children about this and prepare them for what to expect on their level planning day.

Parent -Teacher Meetings

Wednesday 20th February 2019

Parent-teacher meetings offer great opportunities to deepen the working relationship between parents and teachers. The meeting is an opportunity for both parties to highlight the child's strengths, discuss academic and/or social challenges, and share vital information.

Parent support for, and involvement in their child/children education is a critical factor which impacts on engagement and achievement. Creating a true partnership in a child's education establishes shared expectations for the child as they work to achieve their full potential.

We therefore encourage all parents to take time to attend these meetings.

Parent Teacher meetings will be held for **all students** from **1.30pm to 6.50pm on Wednesday 20th February**

Parent Teacher meetings will be of **10 minutes duration**.

To book a time for the parent teacher meeting you will need to access your **COMPASS** parent portal.

Access to bookings will be available from Monday 11th February. See the steps below to make this booking.

Using COMPASS you will be able to book the times that suit you best from any internet-connected computer. A computer is available in the front office foyer during school hours (8.45am – 4.00pm), if you do not have internet access at home or elsewhere.

To make the Parent-Teacher meeting booking for your child/children complete the following steps:

- Log into the Compass parent portal using your Username and Password
- On your Compass homepage a list of your children will be displayed. A meeting link will appear under their name
- Click on this link
- Select a booking sheet. This will display the parent teacher conference dashboard, which includes a list of all of the times available
- Other parents may be making bookings at the same time that you are using the system. It is possible, though unlikely, that a time slot is displayed to you as available, but is then booked by another parent shortly afterwards. If you then attempt to book this time slot it will not be available and a message will be displayed to indicate this.
- If you encounter any problems using Compass system, please contact the school office by phone on 9314 5869
- This process will need to be repeated for every child
- Please consider that you will need to move between rooms for sibling meetings and to therefore leave a gap to allow you to make your next meeting appointment time

Training and induction for Volunteers required

At Kingsville, volunteers work together with staff to enhance the learning of our students in many different ways, such as sporting days, excursions, fundraising events and classroom help, etc. In order to become a Kingsville volunteer, parents/guardians must comply with relevant procedures and practices to ensure we are compliant with the relevant legislation. We also are required to provide volunteers with information about school expectations and protocols associated with being a volunteer at Kingsville.

Please note any parent/guardian who wishes to volunteer in any capacity in the school must :

1. have and be able to produce a copy of their valid Working with Children card and
2. participate in the one hour information session which will ensure both OH&S Induction and, the necessary information required for parents to be able to participate in the classroom helpers or other school programs

Yearly induction is required but volunteer training does not need to be carried out each year. Parents of course are welcome to stay for the full session for a refresher.

All sessions will be held in the staffroom and the induction session will take approximately 15 minutes. The parent helper session (see information below) will take 30 minutes. Parents attending these sessions will need to sign in via the visitor's book at the main office.
