Student Enrolments 2022

As outlined in the last newsletter of April 23rd preparing for student enrolments for the next school year begins early in Term 2. The first step is always working to establish what the requirement for places is likely to be from our **current kingsvile families**. Over the last 8 years we have had a high percentage of our Prep/Foundation students who have a sibling / siblings already at school. Over the last 4 yearsthis has averaged just under 40%

So -

we need a response now from any current families who are likely to request a placement for a child into Foundation 2022. Whilst there may be some 'in question' placements e.g. age, or possible residential move or, a further year in pre-school please lodge your details now to assist us in this first planning stage. If there are any need for changes later in the year then your request can be adjusted.

Parent Teacher Communication

At Kingsville we acknowledge that at times, parents have concerns about their child's education. Kingsville Primary School understands the importance of providing helpful and timely responses to inquiries from parents and carers and, works to resolve issues and concerns within the context, setting compliances and accountabilities of a State Government School.

Staff respond to general queries as soon as possible however ask that parents allow 2 – 3 working days for a follow up detailed response if required. We will endeavor to respond to more pressing matters within 24 hours as possible.

Issues or concerns are most effectively dealt with if they are raised in the following ways:

1. Communicate with the teacher. Outline the issue / concern and any possible solutions to the teacher, if you consider that the issue has not been resolved at the conclusion, state this to the teacher

2. If the issue is not resolved, make an appointment with the Principal or Assistant Principal. Let them know what you wish to discuss, as this will facilitate the process.

3. Meet with the Principal or Assistant Principal. Results of this meeting may include an agreed course of action, further discussion with the people involved and / or outside support for the child, school or family.

4. If you are dissatisfied with the outcome of the meeting, phone or write to the Principal again to air your concerns. If the school does not receive further information it is reasonable for the issue to be considered resolved.

Please refer to the [Parent Concerns and Complaints Policy](#) on the school website for greater details when resolving issues.

It is important that grievances are kept confidential, and although at times you may wish to seek support from friends or an advocate, it is very important to do this wisely.

Please avoid discussing concerns within your child's hearing as this can further complicate some situations. If this is unavoidable, it is important that your child understands that you have confidence that the issue will be resolved confidentially at the school level. Criticism of individual staff members does not support your child's education as it undermines trust and confidence, and can have an adverse effect upon the child's learning.

JSC Announcement: Nude Food Day



The entire JSC have had many discussions about how we can take 'action' and ensure we have a healthier environment and a cleaner school. We also feel that we can make a positive difference by becoming more aware of climate change and pollution. With this in mind, on the **4th of May** Kingsville PS will be having our very first Nude Food Day.

Nude Food means: food without excess packaging on it. An option may be to use beeswax wraps or containers instead of glad wrap or plastic wrappers of any kind.

By having a Nude Food Day we would be reducing the rubbish and plastic that needs to go into bins and sent to landfill. This would also help the natural environment around the school, such as Cruickshank Park and Stony Creek.

Please note that students will not get in trouble if they bring a plastic wrapper to school. The class with the least rubbish will win the Nude Food Day Challenge and be awarded with a certificate.

On Wednesday the 28th of April 6JI went around to all the rooms and did a rubbish audit of the school. They found that there was 19.2kg of plastic rubbish in our bins just from that one day. This exercise reiterated the need for a Nude Food Day. It has also given us some data so that we can see the impact our Nude Food Day could have.

Supporting your child at home with their maths learning

Within the next few newsletters, we will be including a series of items with tips about how you can support your child at home with their maths learning. As parents you play a significant role in your child's learning by setting expectations, nurturing curiosity, and encouraging a love of learning. But this does not have to be a big, daunting task.

There are a few simple things that you can do (and are already doing), that support your child with their growth in mathematics. You can help build your child's numeracy skills and engagement by supporting their learning and giving them opportunities to discuss and use maths in different ways. We encourage positive talk about mathematics so that students are able to see the value, real-life applications of maths and how important mathematical skills are to everyday life.

Incidental maths at home:

You will probably find that you are already immersing your child in a range of incidental maths activities and exposing them to a variety of maths concepts and strategies at home. These include board and card games, such as snakes and ladders, Uno, Monopoly, chess, checkers, etc.

When participating in these types of maths activities, encourage your child to talk about and justify their maths strategies. Model this for your child, explaining why you have selected specific strategies and what you were thinking during this process. This will help boost their confidence, deepen their understandings and increase their mathematical thinking.

Examples of incidental maths to build your child's mathematical skills

- Encourage your child to help with cooking (especially measuring out ingredients)
- Practise counting when grocery shopping with your child (for example, counting the number of apples you put into the bag).
- Encourage your child to draw, create and describe their own patterns. You could include them when creating borders on greeting cards.
- Ask your child questions that prompt investigation. How could we measure the...? What shapes can you see? Which is closer: the sandpit or the swing? How tall can you build a tower before it falls?
- Incorporate counting into everyday activities such as cutting fruit into six pieces and ask your child to count the pieces.
- Using playing cards, order the numbers from smallest to largest, or largest to smallest.
- Use a wall measuring chart to measure the height of people in your family. Compare the differences between heights.
- Jigsaw puzzles, tangrams or shape sorting toys help teach your child problem solving skills and spatial awareness.

He believes that the more fun the child has during their early reading experiences, the more likely they will be to return to books, improve their emergent literacy skills, and later find joy in reading and learning.

Philip's books have been translated into multiple languages, and published in over 25 countries around the world. Since his first book was published in 2017, Philip has received multiple accolades, including Honours from the Children's Book Council of Australia, and making the list for the Kate Greenaway Medal in 2018.

Sharing your child's growth through a 'point of time' assessment activity.

Knowing our learners

Assessment is the ongoing process by teachers of gathering, analysing and reflecting on evidence to make informed and consistent judgements to improve student learning. Teachers use the information from assessment to understand their learners. They share the assessment results with students to celebrate their achievements and set future learning goals. By continuously sharing feedback with students and their families, students have the opportunity to work towards their learning goals with support from school and home. Assessment is not an end in itself, but rather a means of educational improvement.

Reporting to families

Kingsville Primary School utilises **Learning Tasks** within **Compass** to share student progress in learning. This insight for families sits alongside Semester Reports, Portfolios and Student Led Conferences. On Friday 7th May, Learning Tasks will be published to families via Compass. The Learning Tasks will provide students and their families with feedback related to a reading and mathematics tasks, as well as a learning goal. We encourage families to discuss this feedback with their child.

The Victorian Premier's Reading Challenge is now open, and Kingsville Primary School is excited to be participating! The Challenge encourages children and students from birth to year 10 to read a set number of books over the year, and record their efforts online. It is not a competition but a personal challenge for students to read a set number of books by 17 September 2021. Students are encouraged to get involved, but participation is optional.

Since the Challenge first began in 2005, more than 3 million students have read nearly 51 million books.

Our Kitchen Garden - Restructure, Rebuild & Rejuvenate

Last year had many challenges, however, while we were preoccupied with other priorities, the garden at Kingsville Primary School continued to change with the seasons. Plants continued to grow and of course so did many weeds. As with so many things in the natural world, we have decided to adapt and embrace this as an opportunity to restructure, rebuild and rejuvenate our community garden.

Consequently, we have divided the garden beds and allocated 2 garden beds to each year level. In addition to this, the gardening club has been allocated 3 gardening beds, there is one garden bed for learning in the specialist areas, and one has also been reserved for the children and staff in the Out of Hours Care (Camp Australia) program. Through this process, we have realised how lucky we are to have such an abundance of space. However, the bigger the garden, the greater the gardening workload, and by sharing this space, we can share the responsibility and privilege. We will use this initiative as a way of educating students about how to care for, and respect this shared space and living things. There is also the added benefit that each child will feel connected to this space.

The gardening club meets each week on a Friday lunchtime and so far, we've had great participation from a range of curious and caring inquirers. The gardening club has spent time weeding, conditioning the soil and decorating new signs for each garden bed. We have also had some help from Tony, our grounds person, who have assisted us with testing our watering system and topping up soil.

Throughout the years, we have had many community members volunteer and help with the organisation, caretaking and facilitation of our gardening program. Of course, we would like to continue this tradition in a Covid safe way. If you are interested in helping out with the garden, please contact Tracey or Monica.

In having parents and carers onsite to assist with the kitchen garden, there are regulations and requirements still in place that must be adhered to which mean, we cannot yet move back to the situation we had prior to Covid-19. The Department of Education - School Operation Guide Victorian Government Schools 30th March 2021 - outlines the relevant legislation and requirements for schools that contribute to a sense of wellbeing and safety for all those onsite.

This means that parents/carers onsite working in the kitchen garden must:

- sign in at the front office
- work in the kitchen garden during the hours of 9am – 11am, 11.30am to 1.30pm or 2.30pm to 3.30pm

- move directly to and from the front office to the kitchen garden
- restrict their movement to the kitchen garden only
- physically distance from other adults or wear a face mask
- adhere to the density rating of the 'space'

We look forward to our kitchen garden becoming a hub for community engagement, a space to enjoy coming together to develop positive relationships with peers and adults, and serve to build a sense of connectedness. A place to learn how to grow, cook, eat and share fresh, delicious, nutritious food and learn the importance of food and animal systems, food security and sustainability.


