Principal's Message

School Council News

The Kingsville PS School Council is pleased to announce that they have recently approved a second **third party provider** to have access to certain areas of the school grounds, after school hours.

We have for some time had the company **Camp Australia Pty Ltd**, licensed to use set buildings and grounds areas to provide an Out of Hours Care program/service. The second "third party" who have recently entered into a License Agreement with Council is the **Kingsville Netball Club Inc** – being part of the Altona Netball Association Inc.

This club is not officially affiliated with Kingsville Primary School however, it utilizes the name of this historic suburb and, it certainly does have a connection to our school. Club origins go back many years to when a small number of KPS students and parents informally worked on netball skills on the grounds after school hours.

As is required for the use of buildings and grounds in Victorian Government Schools applications by outside parties for use of school facilities must be submitted and, if approved a License Agreement is entered into with council. This is required for any ongoing regular use of grounds or buildings. This formality ensures protection for all stakeholders and transparency for the school community overall.

Last night the first group of KNC players benefiting from the recent agreement engaged in after school netball practice. All of the arrangements agreed to by school council and the netball club saw a very successful start.

As Principal, I would like to thank all parties involved for their patience and hard work which contributed to this success including but not limited to –

- all members of the KPS School Council lead by president Glen Yates who spent significant time and energy throughout the recent negotiations leading to licence agreement
- management of the Kingsville Netball Club for their engagement and patience in working to ensure a fully compliant framework was able to be developed as required for the licence agreement
- Kingsville families and students who are members of the club for their patience – ***you and other players now have a guaranteed place of practice moving forward***

Shade Sail Project

There has been great progress this week regarding the continuing work on the "Shade Sail Project" in the Quiet Play Area. Thank you to staff, students and parents, who have navigated around the barriers and reduced access areas. On Thursday morning resilience and creativity was highly visible as Foundation teachers and staff volunteering rose to the challenges of access and the rain. They directed students entering from the Sommerville Rd gates and, provided a direct route straight through the Foundation/Junior school building and, out into the playground. Quick thinking and very well done.

We expect that the project will be completed by the end of this term and that will certainly be a cause for celebration and maybe a ribbon "cut".



Locally Raised Funds

Locally raised funds are a vital component of school budgets in every Victorian Government School. They are an essential source of income and the school council sets an income level expected possible, for each year within the cash budget. This figure along with all of the other income streams support the Programs and Budgets in any year and in 2022 there are 26 Program Budgets. This year the council has set the target figure/budget income for locally raised funds at \$40,000.

Over the past two years opportunity for the FOKPS to bring the community together and raise funds has been limited. In 2022 however the FOKPS subcommittee of school council are well and truly back.

Fundraising actions this year which have included the Easter Raffle, Mother's Day Stall, Casual Clothes Day Term 1, and the recent and very successful sales on Election Day being, the sausage sizzle and cake stall have, raised a total of

\$8,717 towards the 2022 target

The Election Day fundraising event has certainly been the stand out so far this year in terms of revenue gained contributing 42% (\$3,720) of the total raised to date. This event is closely followed by the dollars that were raised from the amazing Mother's Day Stall which provided 32% of the total raised (\$2,778). The Easter Raffle was also a significant contributor and provided 20% (\$1,791) of the total.

All of these events have raised funds and ensured enjoyment, engagement and opportunities for students and families. Planning for second semester fundraising is underway and the school council and subcommittee will moving forward provide details.

School Uniform

In regards to school uniform please see below;-

School Council approved School Uniform Policy sees the requirement of a compulsory "Dress-Code".

This code as documented requires school uniform listed items to be bought from the stipulated provider, PSW. Alternatively plain items in school uniform colours with no other logos writing or decoration may be worn.

Whilst we encourage all students to be proud of clubs, groups and teams they are members of, such team clothing **is not** to be worn during the normal school week - casual clothes day and camps are exceptions.

Cyber Safety and Wellbeing

As a PYP school of the International Baccalaureate and an accredited eSMART school, Kingsville Primary School embraces the benefits of technology and are committed to empowering our students and our school community to navigate cyber risk and wellbeing.

Last year, Kingsville provided an online safety and digital wellbeing webinar for parents and carers. Cyber safety expert Martine Oglethorp, from the Modern Parent Organisation <https://themodernparent.net/> gave parents practical information and advice around the safety of the specific apps our children are using, online drama and cyberbullying, social media and self-esteem, managing video gaming, and accessing inappropriate content. The parent feedback from this event was very positive.

On Friday the 17th of June, Martine will be back at Kingsville Primary School working with our Year Six students to complement our digital literacy curriculum and eSMART practice.

In these sessions, students will be engaged in learning about cyber safety, issues of privacy, digital literacy and resilience. Students will examine actual online conversations and scenarios where things have gone wrong, and thus give them the language to come up with better responses, actions, and words to ensure a better outcome.

Some of the topics students will examine include:

- To share or not to share
- Who are you talking to?
- Friend or follower: can you differentiate?
- Avoiding digital drama
- Cyberbullying: the difference between mean and bullying, and what steps we can take
- The realities of online connections
- Building self esteem away from the screens
- The importance of your digital footprint ...today
- Avoiding digital distractions and finding the balance

In the lead up to this student event, there will be some additional articles in the newsletter with information to support families in navigating the digital world for safety and wellbeing.

ONLINE ORDERING Your child's school photos are now available for secure online purchase, please note if you are ordering online, you do not need to return an envelope to the school

Please Note: If you miss photo day, portrait and group packages can still be ordered online for 7 days afterwards with no late fees. After that time, late orders will require separate processing and handling and therefore will incur a \$15 late fee per package.

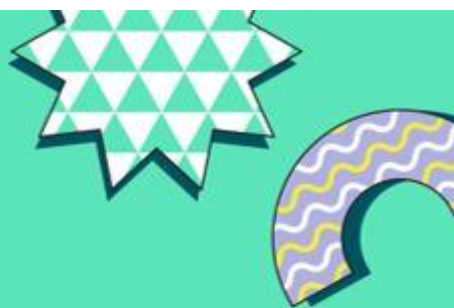

What:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The AMC is an engaging, 30-problem competition that demonstrates the importance and relevance of mathematics in students' everyday lives. - It is open to students in years 3 to 12. - The Australian Mathematics Competition (AMC) has 25 multiple-choice questions and five questions that need whole number answers. - All students are provided with a report showing how they performed on each problem with wider statistical rankings.
Why:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Kingsville students have participated and competed in the AMC over several years. - The AMC offers an opportunity for Kingsville students to extend and challenge themselves in Mathematics. - Programs and opportunities such as the AMC connect Kingsville students with other students from around Australia.
When:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The 2022 AMC will be held across Australia between Wednesday 3rd August and Friday 5th August. - At Kingsville Primary School, the AMC will be held on Wednesday 3rd August.
Fee:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - There is a cost of \$7.50 to participate. - This covers testing booklets, answer sheets, postage and handling.

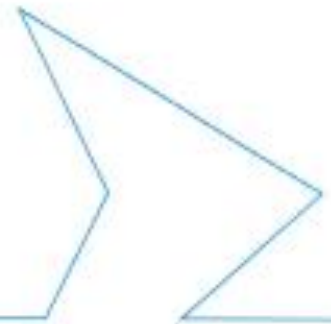
