# Assistant Principal's Message

## Student Free/Curriculum Day – Friday 10<sup>th</sup> June

Each year schools receive 4 student-free days (when student instruction does not occur) for professional development, school planning and administration, curriculum development and student assessment and reporting.

As part of Kingsville Primary School's commitment to continuous improvement these curriculum or student free days are used as a valuable opportunity to for all staff to engage in learning, conversation and work directly related to whole school improvement.

Today, Friday 10<sup>th</sup> June, Kingsville staff engaged in the Pre-Review Self-Evaluation (PRSE) process, a key component of our DET School Review. This involved:

- reflecting on our current Strategic Plan goals, targets and key improvements strategies
- analysing a range of data sets, reflecting on our successes and challenges over the last four years
- identifying enablers, blockers and next steps in line with our current Strategic Plan
- working collaboratively in celebrating our highlights from the past four years

This work is vital in the current school review model and support the school leadership and improvement team in finalizing our PRSE before moving through the review process.
