Assistant Principal's Message

In AFL parlance, the 3rd quarter is deemed the “Premiership quarter” – a time when teams make their move, separating the good from the great. Whilst not directly applicable to our setting, Term 3 offers an opportunity for teachers and students to build on the strong foundations laid during the first semester – academically, socially and emotionally. Students and teachers have returned refreshed, and classroom routines are well established allowing for a quick return to the high quality teaching and learning occurring before the holiday break .

Term 3 at Kingsville in 2022 also sees a range of activities, experiences and events occurring across different levels of the school. These include, but aren't limited to, Year 6 Canberra camp and 3/4 Camp Wilkin (for half the cohort, with the other half attending in term 4), a variety of incursions and excursions across different levels, and the return of parent helpers to the classroom (more information around this will be published via Compass early next week!)

Student Led Conferences

This past week saw the return of **Student Led Conferences** in classrooms. Student led conferences are a component of our reporting and assessment agenda and actions, allowing parents and carers to step into the learning space and reflect and celebrate on the achievements of their child. For many parents and carers, this was the first time they had been into a classroom since their own time at school, due to the restrictions that have been in place. Students proudly and confidently shared their work, their learning, and their classrooms, making up for these missed opportunities. Next week in the newsletter we'll share student reflections and feedback on the student led conferences.

Planning Week

This week all classroom and specialist teachers engaged in planning week. This provided an opportunity for teachers to collaboratively plan the teaching and learning experiences and opportunities that will take place throughout the semester. This planning was driven by student, class and cohort data, making the teaching and learning relevant and meaningful for students.

Optional Parent Teacher Meetings

Parents/Carers would have received communication from the school that they can access their child/children's Semester 1 report at the end of last term. As in previous years we will once again be providing the opportunity for parents to make a booking with their child's teacher in the third week of term 3, beginning 25th July to discuss aspects of the report.

This will be a meeting free week for teachers which will allow them to allocate some time to meet with parents/guardians who have specific questions regarding their child's report.

This opportunity is designed to specifically answer any questions that have not already been addressed in the semester report or, to seek clarification regarding aspects of the report.

If parents/guardians would like to take up this opportunity, it is vital that they have read the report and have prepared related questions. To arrange mutually suitable time (10 -15 minutes), to meet with your child's teacher you will need to make contact directly with the classroom teacher – **email is the preferred option**. This request should be made before **Friday 22nd July**. These meetings are able to take place face-to-face, via phone or via Webex – please communicate with your child's teacher to confirm this.

Dear families of Camp Australia Kingsville Primary School,

It is also important that you also phone the service number on 0401 054 261 to notify us if any changes are being made especially if there is a late booking. Also to inform us if you have collected the child early from school knowing your child is booked for After Care. PLEASE let us know on 0401 054 261. Please remind your children on the day of your booking to come to after care room if booked as soon as school is finished.

Reminder for families who have children with medication to please come a day prior to your booking to complete an action plan along with any medications clearly labelled. This is particularly so for any new or changed medications. This will facilitate us in preparing for any additional training that could be required for your child.
