Whilst we have no knowledge of when this current lockdown may end, we wish to thank and congratulate everyone for the stellar effort undertaken by all to engage with the remote learning program for the sixth time. Every one of us should be proud of the part we played during term 3. We continue to be impressed with the efforts, commitment and resilience displayed by our teachers, students, families, and the wider community.

In celebrating this, the last week of term will have some special events planned into the program. These will switch things up so to speak and change the tempo of the sessions on offer for the children on some occasions as we end the term.

This will begin with the specialist team, offering the children something different, next **Wednesday September 15th** through a '**Choose Your Own Adventure Day**'. All children will be attending their morning wellbeing check-in with their class teacher as usual, then the options begin! Children will be offered two separate sessions from each specialist area across the course of the morning. The catch is though, that two of these sessions will be running concurrently and children will need to choose which one they would like to attend. These sessions will be offered across the whole school giving all children the opportunity to participate in specialist activities.



The specialist team have had a great deal of fun creating these sessions, and they hope that the children have just as much enjoyment participating in them. Some sessions will require preparation beforehand so please parents, read over the activities with your child beforehand so that they are prepared.

Then on **Thursday September 16th**, teachers have planned, for classes linked through '**buddy and amici**' relationship, to connect online and participate in a cross-level collaborative experience. This session will reconnect these important social and support networks for the children and stimulate the important sense of community and belonging to the school.



Thank you to all involved in ensuring the program for the last week of the term will include these engaging activities.

The Victorian Premier's Reading Challenge 2021 is ending on 17 September.



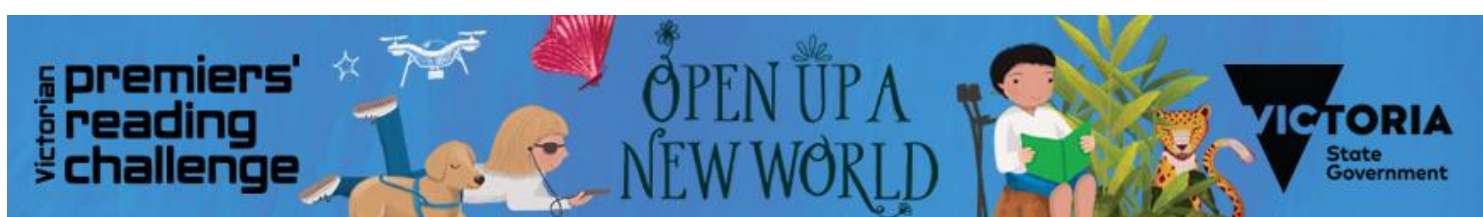

Number of books read to meet the Challenge:

Level 3 – Level 6	Read 15 books (including 10 or more Challenge books)
